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WARNING SIGNS DURING PREGNANCY TO GO TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM

1. Four or more contractions an hour not relieved by drinking 2 glasses of fluids
2. Severe abdominal pain
3. Swelling of the hands, feet and face with or without a headache, unrelieved by rest, elevation and Tylenol
4. Persistent nausea and vomiting (continues past 24 hours)
5. Decrease in or absence of fetal movement.
6. Headache and blurred vision unrelieved with fluids, Tylenol and rest after 2 hours
7. Fever greater than 101, 2 hours after taking Tylenol
8. Gush or trickle of water from vagina
9. Vaginal bleeding can be normal after intercourse or exam, if heavy or with pain go to the Emergency Room
